Peter and Norman Islands

Embark on a Pirate Adventure to kickstart your journey. Norman Island, which served as the inspiration for Robert Louis Stevenson's "Treasure Island," and Peter Island, once inhabited by Christopher Columbus and the infamous pirate Blackbeard, are two must-see destinations.

Let your experience begin! When timing suits you, dive into the vibrant turquoise waters at The Indians and befriend the local reef fish. For the more adventurous, head to Treasure Point and scour the caves for hidden treasure like true pirates. Looking to relax but still enjoy the warm crystal-clear waters? Head to White Bay Beach and float while sea turtles swim about. Once the sun begins to set, make your way to the famous Willy T floating bar, where a cold cocktail is the perfect end to a day in paradise.



Salt and Cooper Islands



Wreck of the RMS Rhone-Salt Island

The Royal Mail Steamer Rhone sank during a hurricane in 1867, making it an excellent spot for diving. If conditions are favorable, even snorkelers can enjoy a glimpse of the wreckage due to good visibility.

Fun Fact: They still harvest salt on this island.

Cooper Island

Prepare to be swept away by the stunning Manchioneel Bay! Sink your toes into the milky-white sand. Take a dip into the crystal-clear waters or jump on a paddleboard or kayak. Get a taste of the good life with a visit to Cooper Island Rum Bar and try the finest rum around. As the day winds down, bask in the glow of an unforgettable sunset view.



The Baths

Ready for a tropical adventure? Take a dip in the world-famous Baths and discover why they're a must-see on every traveler's list. Not far away, Devil's Bay boasts mesmerizing, transparent waters, perfect for snorkeling. Get your history fix at the old Copper Mine, a relic from the early 19th century. And don't miss out on the stunning views and cool drinks from the bar, perched atop the Baths. Let's go!



Virgin Gorda

Virgin Gorda is one of the largest islands in the BVI. If you're a hiker or a shutterbug, you'll be spoiled for choice with stunning vistas to explore, including Gorda Peak where you can snap shots of Sir Richard Branson's Necker Island, Eustatia Island, and Prickly Pear. If hiking isn't your thing, don't fret! Take a leisurely sail to Saba Rock, where you can sip on a refreshing drink or zip through the waves on a hydrofoil.




Relax on the tranquil beaches

Cane Garden Bay

Cane Garden Bay is one of Tortola's most vibrant destinations, blending relaxation with lively island culture. Its turquoise waters are perfect for swimming, paddleboarding, or surfing when the long wave breaks, while the soft white sand invites a leisurely stroll. Step into history at the Callwood Rum Distillery, where tastings reflect centuries of handed down family traditions. Take your time exploring the local galleries that highlight the beauty of island art.



As the sun begins to set, the bay transforms with the sounds of live music, the energy of beachside dancing, and views that stay with you long after. Keep an eye on the horizon for the elusive green flash. During festivals the atmosphere becomes even more vibrant, and you may find Moko Jumbies captivating the crowd as they dance high above on their towering stilts.
